









UNLY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS FOR NEW FRESHMEN

The following are UNLV's top academic scholarships offered to new freshmen who achieve academic excellence in high school. To be eligible for any of the following scholarships, you must be:

- Accepted to UNLV by February 1. You must submit a complete application by January 1 to be guaranteed an admission decision by this date. You must also complete the FAFSA by February 1.
- · A new full time freshman who has never attended college.
- · International students do not qualify.

Regional scholarships listed on the reverse side of this document may be awarded in addition to one of the following academic scholarships.

Eligible students may be awarded one of the academic scholarships listed above in addition to the Millennium, Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) or Rebel Challenge Scholarships. Scholarship funding is limited, and priority consideration is provided to students who meet the appropriate application deadlines and selection criteria.

What is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)?

To be awarded financial aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Apply online at fafsa.gov.

What is a grant?

Grants are awards based on financial need that do not need to be repaid. This type of financial aid is awarded by UNLV, the state of Nevada, and the U.S. Department of Education utilizing your FAFSA information. Grant dollars have limited financial funding streams.

The **UNLV Grant** is awarded to students who show financial need based on their FAFSA information. Awards vary between \$1,000 and \$4,000. Visit finaid.unlv.edu to learn more.

What is a loan?

Loans, which can help you pay your tuition and fees, as well as living expenses, must be repaid, usually after you graduate, withdraw from college, or drop below half-time enrollment status (fewer than six credit hours per semester for undergraduates).

What is a scholarship?

Scholarships, like grants, do not need to be repaid. Many scholarships are awarded by private donors based on a variety of criteria established by the donor of the scholarship program. Scholarship awards vary from \$250 to \$20,000 per year. Many scholarship awards are renewable, but some are a one-time occurrence. Complete the "scholarship" section of the Application for Admission to be eligible.

Recipients will be awarded up to \$11,000 per year for the Rebel Challenge Scholarship. Awards will vary based on student's academic qualifications.
